



The high school students whose summer jobs involve changing movie theatre marquees. Hollywood has come down with a serious case of title elongation. That is, if you can figure out the title at all.

There was a time when summer movies came with tidy, muscular names: Speed. Armageddon. Twister. Now, with studios churning out more sequels than ever, and eager to link their new releases to existing brands or signal a franchise in the making, titles have grown exponentially.

Navy's Failure To Block Quick Blow Explained

WASHINGTON, Dec. 8 (UP). --- The United States forces have destroyed "a number of Japanese planes and submarines" in operations against Japan in the battle of the Pacific, the White House announced today, and the Japanese dive bomber attacks on Hawaii left 3,000 casualties.

- White House Secretary Stephen T. Early announced that 1.500 persons were wounded and about the same number killed in the dive bomber attacks which Japan; launched on the Island of Oahu at dawn yesterday. He added that despite the large number of bombs dropped upon the city of Honolulu itself, there were relatively few casuallies there.

Asked how he dremed it possible for the Japanese alreraft to pierce the outer defenses of the United States' strongholds in the Pacific, Early gave this explanation as representing "expert con-

He said he was not authorized to expound on the international angle as to who was the aggressor. However, he stated:



TIP #6 BE BRIEF

- Key points only
- Paraphrase
- No one wants to READ a video

Too much text on a screen is hard on the eyes. No one wants to look at a video and have to read an entire screen of information. Paraphrase the key points. Use bullets and create lists if necessary. If you have lots of information to express, add a voice over and explain the details that aren't on the screen.

EXAMPLE

- Key points only
- Paraphrase
- No one wants to READ a video
