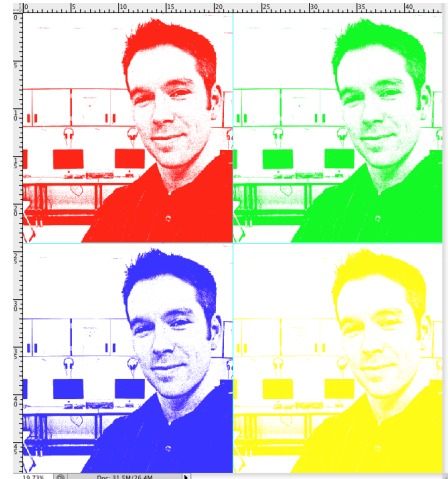


Photoshop Assignment #1

"Creating an Andy Warhol-like Effect"

This tutorial will allow you to work with/on:

- Filters
- Guides
- Resizing the canvas
- Threshold dialog
- Moving a layer



Instructions:

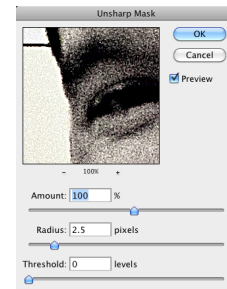
Take a portrait of a person in the room or use an existing image of a person that will be the image used in your creation. Download the photo onto your desktop and open it in Photoshop.

Part 1 - Formatting the photo

- Click on the crop tool in the tool box on the left of the screen
 - Try to crop a SQUARE portion of the image.
- Once the portion of the image area you want to use for the assignment is selected, press RETURN to crop it. (Make sure it is SQUAREish)



- Go to Filters > Sharpen > Unsharp Mask
 - Set the Amount to 100%
 - Set the Radius to 2.5 pixels
 - Set the Threshold to 0 levels
- Go to Image > Adjustments > Threshold
 - Adjust the slider arrow to get an interesting black and white effect.
- Press OK
- Go to Select > All (CMD+A)
- Go to Edit > Copy (CMD+C)
 - *this will be used in a couple minutes*

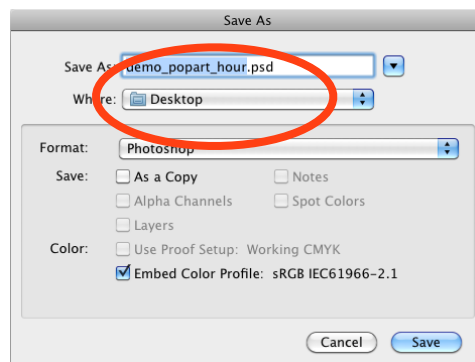
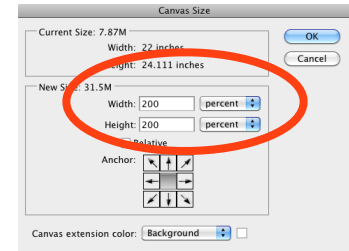

Part 2 - Creating the Pop Art

- Go to File > New
 - *By default, the Width and Height should be equal to the dimensions of the cropped image you just copied onto the clipboard.*
- Press OK
- Go to Image > Canvas Size
 - From the drop-down, select '**percent**' instead of 'pixels'
 - Change Width and Height both to 200%
 - Press OK
- Go to File > Save As > last name_popart_hour.psd (**ON THE DESKTOP**)

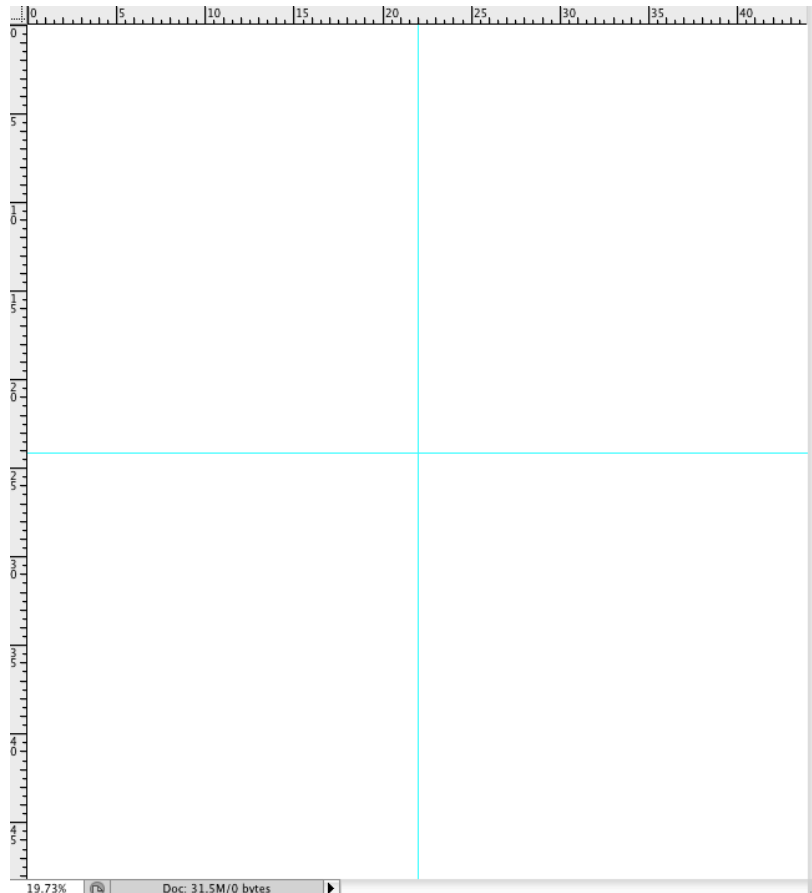


Part 3 - Working with Guides

- Press the Command Zero (CMD+0) on the keyboard to zoom out on the white square
 - *note: this step doesn't look like it does anything, but trust me, it did!*
- Go to View > Rulers (CMD+R)
- Click on the horizontal ruler at the top of the document and drag down.
- Place the line in the exact MIDDLE of the document. (it should snap)
- Click on the Vertical ruler on the left of the document and drag right

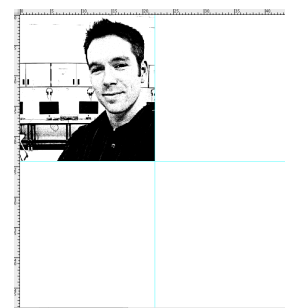
- Place the line in the exact MIDDLE of the document. (it should snap)

The end result should look like this:



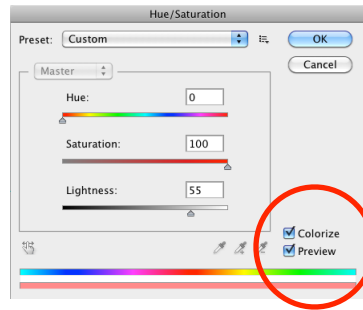
Part 4 - Coloring

- Go to Edit > Paste (CMD+V)
 - This places one copy of the base image in the center



- Select the Move tool (V) and position the image in the top left corner
- Go to Image > Adjustments > Hue/Saturation (CMD+U)

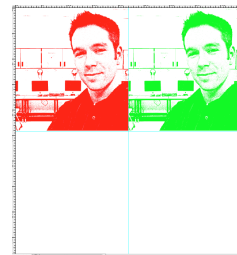
- Click COLORIZE
 - Set Hue to 0
 - Set Saturation to 100
 - Set Lightness to +55
- You should now see RED



- Go to Edit > Paste (CMD-V)
- Select the Move (V) tool and position the image in the top right corner
- Go to Image > Adjustments > Hue/Saturation (CMD-U)

- Click COLORIZE
- Set Hue to 125
- Set Saturation to 100
- Set Lightness to +55

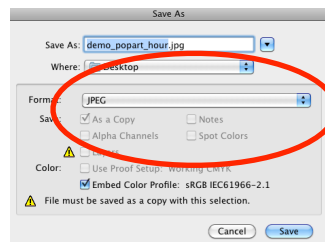
You should now see Green



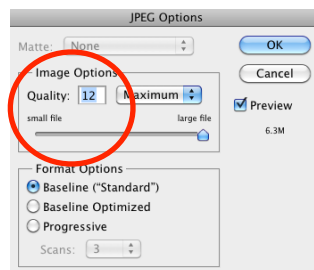
- Repeat these steps to fill and color the lower two corners in Blue and Yellow of your choice

Part 5 - Closing out

- Go to File > Save (CMD+S)
- Go to File > Save As
- Change Format to JPEG
- Press Save
- Set Quality to 12
- Press OK



Check that the file is named properly and on your desktop as a .JPEG for easy access.



• Turn in the Assignment
