

## Shooting Assignment Turn-in Day Workflow:

1. Download all photos from camera to server space using Bridge or Lightroom.
2. Organize, inspect, and use ratings/picks to find the 10 best photos.
3. Open each of the 10 best in Photoshop, Lightroom or Camera Raw.  
(Edit, crop, touch up, and LEVELS adjust each of the 10 best)
4. Open your blog.
5. Start a new POST titled after the **assignment subject** you shot (ex: Nature).
6. Write an introduction paragraph summarizing the subject you shot and the experiences you had doing it. What did you learn in this shoot?
7. Add a large example of the BEST PHOTO under the intro paragraph.
8. Add the “exposure triangle” information for the best photo. (Aperture/ Shutter Speed/ISO)
9. Write about any EDITING you did to the best photo. Explain it in a sentence or two.
10. Add the remaining 9 photographs in a Gallery.
11. Proofread and publish the post.
12. Drag a copy of your BEST PHOTO into the server PHOTO>HAND IN>PROPER CLASS folder.
13. Ensure the name is LASTNAME\_ASSIGNMENT.jpg
14. Go to my website and check out other classmate’s work from the week on their blogs.

## What do the numbers mean?

Below you will find an appropriate explanation for the grading that will take place on your best photo.

<b>Image Quality</b>	High quality; images are properly exposed, effectively retouched/ altered without being distracting.	Images slightly out of focus creating a distracting element in the photograph. Changes in the aperture or shutter speed would improve the effectiveness of the image. Image needs additional work in Photoshop to be properly exposed. Overworked in Photoshop; images do not look natural, overly filtered/ manipulated.	Images are not properly exposed and/or focused. Images have not been corrected in Photoshop for color, sharpness, and removal of distracting elements.
<b>Composition</b>	Strong composition. Images are strong because of the proper use of composition rules.	Image composition has potential, but other angles, focal lengths and positioning of subjects will improve image.	The images are shot in a plain manner, distracting from the composition and leaving image stagnant. Backgrounds are busy or distract from the focus of the image.
<b>Assignment Fit</b>	Strong choice of subject matter for the given assignment. Images are edited to include only the strongest images.	Images meet the minimum level of quality and subject matter to satisfy the assignment. Subject matter could be improved; some images appear to be filler material.	Subject matter does not satisfy the assignment. Images are missing or too many; student needed to edit down number.
<b>Overall</b>	The submitted images display a strong overall quality.	The submitted images display a nice overall quality with some room for improvement.	The submitted images display a minimum of quality with lots of room for improvement.
